## Errata Page As of: Friday, February 27, 2015

The errata page was the most updated information changes available. After the date shown, there is always the possibility of changes being added to future pages. Page 18 – Iron Bridge Café has changed its hours and closes at 2p not 4p and require advance registration to stay at the hostel.

Page 20 – the Chevron at 500 Appalachian Highway may accept packages sent there for hikers. Call ahead for this service. Hours are 6a-9p 7 days a week and the store is only 1.6 miles from the trail, making it the closest resupply option.


Page 20 – L & A Country Store has closed.


Page 22 – North Georgia Mountain Outfitters has moved. Their new address is 14244 Hwy 515 N, Suite 1200 Ellijay, GA 30536 just past mile marker 14, on Highway 515/US76, is in a small commercial center several miles north of Ellijay and 7.5 miles south of where the BMT crosses the highway in Gilmer County. Situated on the right side of the highway going north, the new 3,500 square foot store will have great visibility for folks passing by on this gateway to the mountains.

Page 28 – Webb Brothers store no longer accepts mail drops. Also have received reports that resupply has been reduced to snack foods or their stock of meal items is such that they sell out very fast, so no longer a potential for long term resupply.

Page 28 – Black Bear Cove Resort is under new ownership and is currently not in business. They may reopen in the future, but for now do not count on this service.


Page 37-43 – The BMTA has been working tirelessly since 2005 to reroute sections of the trail for safety and enjoyment. In 2014 we were able to reroute the trail away from the dangerous road walk along "The Tail of the Dragon" and in 2015 we have started the work necessary for rerouting the trail through the Slickrock Wilderness. This section was partially rerouted for safety in order to avoid the sometimes dangerous ford of Slickrock Creek, but mainly because our first choice of routes was over Bob Bald and past "The Hangover" in early 2015 this route was approved and marking of the trail signs has started as of the writing of the errata. The old route is still also marked and there, so you can use it as an option now. The following pages should substitute the current pages shown in your guide.





In February 2015 the BMTA recived approval for a new route through the Slickrock/Joyce Kilmer Wilderness. This is close to the original intended route through this area and adds some excellent spots to the trail for camping and views as well as other places of interest. Pictured here is a map to orient you to the old and new routes. Some signs for the old route still exist and the BMTA considers the old route an authorized optional route for hikers to use.


Points of interest include Bob Bald, The Hangover, the overlook, Windy Gap, and the cemetary at Nichols Cove. This also adds a great trail friendly resupply point at Tapoco Lodge, please let them know how much you appriciate their support of the BMT!



- 178.2 FS Property boundry. Between here and Meadow Branch Road 179.2 is private property. Though it might be tempting to camp between here and the lodge, please don't. If you want to camp before hitting the lodge for resupply there are a couple possible campsites at 177.5 and 177.9
- 179.0 Meadow Branch Road/US129 Intersection across from Topoco Lodge. Meadow Branch flows downstream from community with septic systems. Treat or filter water.

Tapoco Lodge, 14981 828.498.2800 Open weekends Feb – Mar, 7 days a week Apr – Dec. A new service with smiling faces happy ready to receive hikers. Lodge dining area B/L/D with grab and go options throughout the day. Evening farm-to-table concept meals prepared by executive chef. Downstairs offers separate restaurant with beer, burgers, pizza, ice cream, and make your own pancake breakfast. 11 Lodge rooms and 20 cabin rooms starting at \$100, up to \$300 depending on accommodations, but at a flat rate meaning there is no extra cost if you split the room with other hikers. So feasibly you could have 4 hikers in a cabin room for \$25 each. Limited Wi-Fi available in lodge. Gift shop plans to include some hiker supplies and gear. Accepts mail drops and have mail out service for sending stuff home or ahead on the trail, call ahead if you plan to send a drop. The Lodge is very friendly to hikers and the BMTA and have let us route the trail over their property. Please pay them respect and help keep the goodwill between us and them! www.tapocolodge.com


Between MP 181.0 and 183.9 the BMT crisscrosses old Forest Service Roads. Water is available but is tricky to find. To make this section a little easier for navigation I've included this small map to helpfully help you find water and pick campsites. The offical BMT route is highlighted in yellow.




Hikers entering the Great Smoky Mountains National Park should know that there are numerous policies dealing with a variety of issues such as permitting, camp sites, pets, and other subjects. A better write up for this is found in the **Benton MacKaye Trail Thru-Hiker's Guide®** on page 44 which this is meant to supplement. That said, there has been some new policy changes to the Service Animal policy that were not available at the time of printing for that guide. Here are the basics:

- ♦ The only authorized service animals are dogs and miniature horses.
- ♦ The animal must be under physical control, i.e. a leash.
- ♦ The animal must perform a specific task for the hiker to mitigate the hiker's disability. Something like alerting the hiker to oncoming seizures, seeing eye animal, etc. Emotional comfort and therapy animals will not apply. That said, there has been some further guidance for PTSD animals for veterans. It appears that those will qualify.
- ♦ Rangers cannot ask what the hikers condition is. But they can ask two questions: 1) is the animal a service animal required because of a disability, and 2) what work or task as the animal been trained to perform. Based on those answers the animal may be allowed.
- ♦ Regardless of service animal status of the dog or miniature horse, if the animal is aggressive or disruptive they can be denied entry or be told to leave once in the park.

I don't claim to be the expert on this, if you think this might be an issue for you please contact the park ahead of time for clarification.
